Description

Created by Congress in 1982, the Annual Congressional High School Art Competition, *An Artistic Discovery*, has showcased the talents of hundreds of thousands of high school students across the United States. The winning entries from each year's competition are displayed for a year in the Cannon Tunnel at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C.

Eligible High Schools

This portion of the competition is open to high school students in the 69 counties of the First Congressional District of Kansas, represented by Rep. Jerry Moran.

Guidelines

1. The competition is open to high school students only.
2. A limit of two (2) artworks may be submitted by any one artist. Teachers and their classes are encouraged to jury possible submissions prior to entry, due to space limitations in the exhibiting gallery. Depending upon the number of works submitted, the judges may select those to be included in the exhibition. It is possible that not all submitted works will be exhibited.
3. There is NO entry fee.
4. Restrictions:
* Format -- **Two-dimensional** works only, no larger than 32 inches by 32 inches, including

frame, and no more than 4 inches in depth.

* Presentation -- **Framing is recommended** (and required before the winning work may be displayed in the U.S. Capitol, please check the *Congressional Guidelines*), but if works are not framed, they must be matted and shrink or acetate wrapped on a rigid backing. Unframed works on canvas stretcher bars are acceptable. All entries must include a **secure hanging device** (eye hooks and wire are preferred, sawtooth hangers, self-adhesive plastic hangers, etc., are acceptable).

* Suitability – The final decision regarding suitability for exhibition in the Capitol is made by a panel of qualified persons chaired by the Architect of the Capitol. The suitability guidelines are outlined in the *Congressional Guidelines*.

5. Categories:

* Painting: Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor, etc.

* Drawings: Pastels, Colored Pencil, Pencil, Charcoal, Ink, Markers, etc.

* Collage

* Prints: Lithographs, Silkscreen, Block Prints, Monoprints, etc.

* Mixed Media

* Computer-generated Art

* Photography

6. The **Student Information/Release Form** must be completed and signed by the teacher, student and parent/guardian to certify the originality of each artwork. This form and the identifying label must be attached to the back of each artwork.

7. Each entry must be **original in concept, design and execution** and may not violate any U.S. Copyright Laws. *Note: Any entry which has been reproduced from an existing photograph, painting or any other work produced by another person is a violation of the Competition Rules and **will not** be accepted.*

The Barton County Arts Council will give all works the same care the works would receive if they were the Council's own property, but assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage by theft or any other cause whatsoever.

The undersigned hereby releases you, your agents and the United States from any and all liability for damage, loss, or misappropriation of the art entry. The undersigned further represents that this art entry is an original work of art personally executed by the entrant for which the entrant has secured, or is entitled to secure a copyright. The undersigned further grants to the Government, through its agent, the Congressional Members Organization, the right to authorize and include this work in a derivative work, such as a compilation wherein this work is depicted as one of a set representing the competition, 'An Artistic Discovery', in a book or pamphlet form for the benefit of the Government. Notwithstanding the above, the undersigned shall retain all proprietary rights, including but not limited to legal title, and beneficial copyright ownership in the art entry during and subsequent to the Art Competition, but grant you, your agents, and the United States a gratuitous license to use the art entry and photocopy or reproduce the same for any non-commercial purpose. CONGRESSIONAL GUIDELINES

General Guidelines

- The competition is open to high school students only. Exceptions will be made for schools that have 7th through 12th grades in one building. Each Member office can choose whether or not to include 7th and 8th grades in the art show if there are schools in their district that fit this criteria.
- Official resources are to be used only to the extent authorized by the Committee on House Administration and the Committee on Standards of Official Conduct.
- In order to allow an art work to hang in the Cannon Tunnel of the U.S. Capitol, the following restrictions are necessary:
 - Two-dimensional only
 - Each art work can be **no larger** than 32 inches by 32 inches to the outside dimensions of the frame
 - No more than 4 inches in depth
 - Art work must arrive in Washington by the time specified and framed to the appropriate Framing Guidelines (see below)
- Art Work Categories are as follows:
 - Paintings: Oil, Acrylics, Watercolor, etc.
 - Drawings: Pastels, Colored Pencil, Pencil, Charcoal, Ink, Markers
 - Collage: Must be two-dimensional
 - Prints: Lithographs, Silkscreen, Block Prints
 - Mixed Media
 - Computer-generated art
 - Photography
- An Attached Form must be signed by the teacher and the student to certify the originality of the art piece.
- Each entry must be an Original in concept, design and execution and may not violate any U.S. Copyright Laws. *Note: Any entry which has been reproduced from an existing photo, painting, or any other work produced by another person is a violation of the Competition Rules and **will not** be accepted.*
- The final decision regarding suitability for the exhibition in the Capitol will be made by a panel of qualified persons chaired by the Architect of the Capitol.

Framing Guidelines

- **All work**, except for oil painting, needs to be protected by a Plexiglas or glass frame.
- **Framed work** should be **no larger** than 32 inches high, 32 inches wide, and 4 inches deep including the outside dimensions of the frame. Please double check size before sending the entry to Washington. Due to wide participation of Member offices, framed work larger than the dimensions will be turned away.
- Frames should be kept as simple and as sturdy as possible. Metal frames are recommended.
- No “snap-on” frames with glass are to be used.
- Plexiglas is better to use than glass over the artwork in order to avoid breakage. If glass is used, cover the entire surface completely with masking tape prior to shipping.

- Matting can enhance or detract from a work of art and should be carefully prepared.
- Use sturdy picture hangers. Two hooks should be attached at the right and the left sides of the back of the work in order to prevent the work from leaning forward or hanging unevenly. This is a judgment call.
- Since frames will be suspended by wire from overhead molding, please do not put wire between the hooks.
- Don not attach labels, ribbon, etc., to the front of the piece or underneath the glass or Plexiglas.
- If the artwork is abstract in design, please indicate on the back side which side is up.
- As directed by the House Oversight and Standards of Official Conduct Committees, each district winner is responsible for framing his or her own winning entry. Any hardship cases should be assisted at the district level; works can no longer be framed by the Architect of the Capitol.
- A copy of the Student Information/Release Form **must be** attached to the back of the artwork along with an adhesive label as shown. (Please make sure you retain a copy for you office.)
- Please use the largest label you have available.

Suitability Guidelines

- As outlined in these guidelines, the final decision regarding suitability for exhibition in the Capitol is left to a panel of qualified persons chaired by the Architect of the Capitol. While it is not the intent to censor any artwork, we do wish to avoid artwork that is potentially inappropriate for display in the Capitol.
- Artwork must adhere to the policy of the House Office Building Commission. In accordance with this policy, exhibits depicting subjects of contemporary political controversy or a sensationalistic or gruesome nature are not allowed. It is necessary that all artwork be reviewed by the panel chaired by the Architect of the Capitol and any portions not in consonance with the Commission's policy will be omitted from the exhibit.
